Challenging the World

On Saturday 25 August, Walcha Central School students competed in the Tournament of Minds competition held in Armidale.

This prestigious, international competition is designed to extend the problem solving, creative thinking and team work skills of its competitors. A team consisting of 7 students from various age groups are given 6 weeks to solve a complex problem and write a play that presents the solution in a dramatic, creative response. Teams have a choice of four possible problems based on either the arts, humanities, science and mathematics or literature.

Walcha Central School entered 2 teams into this competition. Our primary team members thoroughly enjoyed the experience and for their first year of competing, were acknowledged for their understanding of mature concepts and their capability to think deeply about how the word *freedom* can be interpreted. MASTERING THE OVER-ARM THROW

Over arm throwing is one of many Fundamental Movement Skills which requires practice. Fundamental Movement Skills are taught at school but you can help teach your child these important skills at home.

To master the over arm throw:

- 1. Focus eyes on target area throughout the throw.
- 2. Stand side-on to target.
- 3. Throwing arm moves in a downward and backward arc
- 4. Step toward target area with foot opposite to throwing arm.
- 5. Hips, then shoulders rotate forward.
- Throwing arm follows through, down and across body.
