Super 9s Rugby League




On Monday 9 November, we travelled to Tamworth with an U14 and an U15 team to participate in a Super 9s Rugby League day.

NSW School Updates app

The NSW School Updates app allows parents and carers to receive operational status updates for NSW public schools. NSW families can now get notified when their school becomes non-operational.

The app will complement the other means of communication available to parents and carers from schools and the Department of Education to ensure families receive timely, accurate information in a crisis. The app is free and available now for iOS and Android users.

SELECTIVE HIGH SCHOOL PLACEMENT FOR 2022

Selective high schools cater for high achieving academically gifted students who may otherwise be without sufficient classmates at their own academic and social level.

Applications for selective high school placement are considered on the combined results of the Selective High School Placement Test and school assessments.

The Selective High School Placement Test will be held for interested students on Thursday 11 March 2021.

Applications open **Tuesday 13 October 2020** and close **16 November 2020**.

You must apply online before the closing date.
