NOTE TO ALL PARENTS/GUARDIANS

Head lice have been reported in the school. Head lice are not only embarrassing **they are** also highly contagious.

What signs to look for:

- Frequent head scratching
- ➤ A fine black powder on the pillow (this is lice faeces)
- Paler coloured material on pillows (this is cast of lice skin)
- The lice themselves (about the size of a sesame seed)
- Tiny white specks stuck near the hair shaft at the nape of the neck, under the fringe or behind ears (nit eggs)

If you find nits buy a head lice lotion/preparation from your chemist. NO prescription is necessary. Treat immediately.

Treating the household:

Head lice can survive away from the human body for about 48 hours and nits up to 10 days. To ensure a lice and nit free environment, wash clothes, bed linen and towels on the hot water cycle for at least 20 minutes.

Soak combs, brushes etc in hot water (+60c) for at least 10 minutes and vacuum everything, including mattresses and upholstered furniture and hats.

A recommended weekly prevention is leaving hair conditioner in the hair for 20 minutes, combing through with a fine toothcomb to remove eggs and then rinsing the hair.

Students need to be kept home from school until you have carried out the treatment described.
